The past few months of EMS have been a tremendous blessing and challenge so far this year. You could say that we have a "tough crowd" of boys that come faithfully every single week. Every week they disrupt others, cause some kind of trouble, and attempt to leave EMS early. Each week the leaders laboriously try to love these boys while at the same time establishing ground rules for behavior. I must admit, my time in EMS this past spring seemed like a breeze compared to this fall.



I have been wondering recently, why do these boys keep showing up every single week? Since they do not seem respectful of others and they try to get out of worship and Bible study, why are they our most faithful attendees? After thinking on this I cannot think of any other answer but this: love. Love is why they keep coming back to EMS. Regardless of what they say they feel, they come to EMS because they are loved and accepted regardless of their life situation.

A question comes to mind that one of the boys asked in Bible study a few weeks back. He asked me why we ate bread and drank juice during worship. At the time I was thrown off by the question considering it was completely off the topic of the Bible study, but now I can see the importance of his question. In communion, we Christians experience in a tangible way our unity with each other and with the Father through the sacrifice of Christ. The relationships broken during the fall are restored during communion. And that is what many of the boys that

More importantly, though, they need to be restored to a relationship with God, and that is why every week we try to teach the middle school students the gospel of grace. And that is why despite the difficulties of the regular group of boys, it is a joy to work with them week in and week out, because God is at work calling them to himself and offering them the perfect love, relationship, and acceptance that they desperately need.

2012 Annual Report

We had 70 adults and high school students **regularly** volunteer at our ministries this year. When factoring in the people who brought meals for our ministries or showed up on Farm workdays, we had nearly 120 people volunteer this year.

Those 70 volunteers put in over 2,200 hours of time with children.

Over 175 children participated in our ministries with many of them receiving at least one of the 1500+ plates of food that volunteers served.

26 families grew produce and made new connections in the Community Garden. We're proud to say that a group of gardeners even dedicated extra time to grow produce for local food pantries.

Through the Breaktime Bakery and Urban Farm ministries, we were able to provide over 2,500 hours of job and lifeskill training. We made over 3,000 cookies, 2,250 bars, and 150 loaves of bread.

Through our first year of the Urban Farm we had over 20 families purchase shares of produce, with each family receiving around 300 lbs. of produce.

God was at work growing NCN in 2012, and we can't wait to see how he uses NCN in 2013!
